NURS 245 Professional Nursing and Health Systems Concepts

Catalog Course Description: This capstone course will focus on current issues in health care and the nursing profession and is designed to facilitate the transition from student to professional registered nurse. Topics of discussion will include national health policy and politics, ethical and bioethical issues, career development, application for state licensure and preparation for the NCLEX-RN examination.

Pre-requisites: NURS 234, BIOL 200, ENGL 101

Co-requisites: NURS 244

Course Learning Outcomes:

- 5. Evaluate the utilization of healthcare system resources to efficiently and effectively manage care.

<u>Spirit of Inquiry</u>: Examine the evidence that underlies clinical nursing practice to challenge the status quo, question underlying assumptions, and offer new insights to improve the quality of care for patients, families, and communities. (Excellence)
